Supporting Student Wellbeing at Dillbadin Primary School: A Whole-School Approach

At Dillbadin Primary School, we believe that student wellbeing is the foundation for learning success. When children feel safe, supported, and emotionally regulated, they are more confident, engaged, and ready to learn. That's why we take a whole school approach to wellbeing, aligning evidence based programs that complement each other and support every child's development.

Let's take a closer look at the wellbeing programs we use and how they work together to build resilience, empathy, respect, and emotional regulation in line with the Victorian Curriculum.

Open Parachute

Open Parachute is a digital mental health program that uses real stories from young people to teach social-emotional skills. Students explore topics like identity, managing emotions, self-worth, and dealing with challenges. The program empowers students to reflect on their feelings and supports emotional literacy, which directly links to the Personal and Social Capability in the Victorian Curriculum.

School-Wide Positive Behaviour Support (SWPBS)

SWPBS provides a consistent, positive behaviour framework across our school. It focuses on teaching and reinforcing expected behaviours in a proactive and inclusive way. It strengthens our school culture by promoting safety, responsibility, and respect- values that are reflected in the Ethical Capability, Civics and Citizenship and Personal and Social Capability strands of the curriculum.

Zones of Regulation

The Zones of Regulation help students identify and manage their emotions by categorising feelings into coloured zones (Blue, Green, Yellow, and Red). This supports emotional regulation, builds vocabulary around feelings, and equips students with tools for self-control and focus, skills that are essential for classroom learning. It aligns with the Health and Physical Education strand, particularly the Personal, Social and Community Health sub strand.

Resilience, Rights and Respectful Relationships (RRRR)

RRRR is a Department of Education recommended program that explicitly teaches emotional literacy, personal strengths, problem solving, stress management, and respect in relationships. It also supports gender equity and inclusion. RRRR builds essential skills outlined in the Health and Physical Education and Personal and Social Capability areas of the curriculum.

How They Work Together

These programs don't work in isolation- they reinforce each other:

- Open Parachute supports emotional literacy and resilience, which are reinforced in RRRR.
- Zones of Regulation gives students a common language for emotion, which helps them understand and follow SWPBS expectations.
- SWPBS provides the behaviour framework that supports respectful relationships, taught explicitly through RRRR.
- Together, they promote a safe, respectful, and supportive learning environment where students feel seen and heard.


Why Wellbeing Matters

- Attend school more regularly
- Participate more actively in class
- Are more likely to succeed academically
- Develop stronger relationships with peers and teachers




Brave Speakers in the Middle Years!





Digital Enrolment

Parent/Carer Quick Reference Guide

Enrolling your child is quick and easy using your laptop or desktop

Before you begin



Google Chrome is the recommended browser



Ensure your listed Emergency contact is someone **other than** Adult A or Adult B



Use of a laptop or desktop is recommended



Check your details are complete **before** submitting

You can't edit after submission



Use the **Save** button if you need to walk away



Have all your digital documents ready as they must be uploaded to your application

e.g. Birth certificate, Proof of Address, Proof of Residency

Finding your designated neighbourhood school

Use <u>Find My School</u> to view a map of available government schools in your area, including your designated neighbourhood (local) school.

Register for an account

- Click the following link: https://students.educationapps.vic.gov.au/s/
- 2. Scroll down and select Register
- 3. Read the acknowledgement and select Continue
- 4. Enter the requested details
- 5. A verification email will be sent to your inbox (check spam folder)
- 6. Click the link that has been emailed to you to complete registration
- 7. You will be prompted to set a new password
- 8. Select Change Password
- 9. You will land on the portal homepage





Ongoing access to the portal

- 1. Select the following link: https://students.educationapps.vic.gov.au/s/
- 2. Enter your credential details
- 3. Select Log in
- When logging in on a new device, you will be prompted for a verification code
 - · check your email for the code
 - · enter code and select Verify
- 5. You will land on the portal homepage
- 6. To log out, navigate to the drop-down menu and select Logout





Submitting an application

- 1. From the portal homepage, select Apply
- 2. Enter new school application details
- Read the privacy notice and then select Continue
- 4. Enter details for each section (including documentation upload)
- Read Review and Declaration and check all details have been provided and are correct

Note: Once an enrolment enquiry is submitted, enrolment details cannot be edited via the Portal


- Select Submit
- 7. The Application Submission screen will appear and then select Close
- 8. You will be taken to your application list




Viewing, withdrawing or adding files to an application

1. In the portal, select application number to view details, including status



- You can monitor the application status along the top status bar, view application details, withdraw the application or view and upload files
 - To withdraw: select Withdraw Application, enter a reason and the application will be closed
 - To add files: select Add Files at the bottom of the browser and follow instructions

Accepting or not accepting an enrolment offer

IMPORTANT NOTE: Please only accept ONE enrolment offer. All enrolments **must** be accepted via the portal.

- When a school makes an offer of enrolment, you will be notified by email and the status in the portal will be updated
- Select the link in the email, and you will be redirected to the portal
- 3. In the portal, My Applications will display Place Offered
- 4. Select application number
- Select Accept Offer to accept the enrolment offer (only accept ONE) and you will be prompted to provide additional information
- 6. Read the privacy notice and select Continue to proceed
- 7. Enter details for each section (including documentation upload)
- 8. Click Submit
- When the school finalises the application, you will be notified by email notification and the status in the portal will be updated
- 10. If you received multiple enrolment offers, or you no longer wish to proceed with your enrolment application:
 - select Do Not Accept (for each offer to be declined)
 - enter a reason and the application will be closed

NOTE: Your personal and health information will be shared with the school once you have accepted an enrolment offer.
