The Big Six

Research has shown that there are six key components to successful beginning reading. Because of their importance, they have become known as 'The Big Six': oral language, phonological awareness, phonics, vocabulary, fluency, and comprehension.

Last newsletter we learnt about Fluency this week we are looking at Comprehension.

Fluency Vocabulary Vocabulary Comprehension Phonics Phonics

How does comprehension contribute to reading success?

Comprehension or understanding what we read is the whole aim of reading. (See Phonics: a guide for families for a diagram that explains the reading process.) Good readers comprehend in different ways depending on the book, article or website they are reading. Some of the ways readers comprehend include:

- predicting before reading and as they read
- making connections between what is being read and the reader's past experiences of books, life and the world
- asking questions about what is being read. What is this character going to do in this situation? Why did that character do that?
- monitoring meaning, checking predictions, confirming them, correcting them, re-predicting and rereading
- creating a mental summary of key parts of the story or information
- creating a mental picture of characters, setting
- inferring, interpreting and reading 'between the lines'
- considering the text purpose. Why did the author write this book? How does the author intend for me to respond to this article?

What can parents can do at home to encourage comprehension?

To help children to see that the aim of reading is meaning making, read together for lots of different purposes then discuss and reflect on the things you read together. Comprehension shouldn't be forced, it should come naturally from reading.

- Share your response to a book read together with your child, for example: I liked the part when ... What did you like? I was surprised by the part when ... What surprised you?
- Talk about other books or experiences that you are reminded of when reading aloud. You could say: This is like that other book we read about ... That part of the story reminded me of when we went to visit Grandma and ...
- Pause and predict at interesting points in a story, when reading aloud, for example: Oh, that's an interesting situation. I wonder what the character is going to do now? How do you think that character is feeling right now? What might happen next?
- Retell stories to each other after reading. Make stories part of play using dress-ups, dolls or figurines, drawing and craft, sand play or play dough.

Spending Time Outside: Boosting Wellbeing and Success at School

As we move through the school year and the weather starts to become cooler, it's essential to remind ourselves of the benefits that spending time outside can have on children's wellbeing and academic success. Research consistently shows that outdoor activities and time spent in nature profoundly impact children's mental, physical, and emotional health.

Being outside promotes physical activity, which helps develop strong muscles, bones, and physical health. But the benefits go beyond just physical fitness. Outdoor play and learning encourage creativity, problem-solving, and teamwork. These experiences help children build resilience, improve focus, and reduce stress. Studies show that students who spend more time outdoors are often more engaged in their schoolwork, are happier, more resilient and better problem solvers.

Outdoor time also fosters a sense of connection with nature, helping children develop a deeper understanding of their environment and sense of self. This connection improves emotional regulation and overall happiness, making students more prepared to face challenges at school with a positive attitude.

At Dillbadin PS, we aim to use all areas of our school for learning, including our beautiful and natural outdoor spaces. We believe students can learn at all times in all different locations, and outdoor learning is incorporated into learning whenever possible.





Enrolling your child is quick and easy using your laptop or desktop

Before you begin



Google Chrome is the recommended browser



Ensure your listed Emergency contact is someone **other than** Adult A or Adult B



Use of a laptop or desktop is recommended



Check your details are complete **before** submitting

You can't edit after submission



Use the **Save** button if you need to walk away



Have all your digital documents ready as they must be uploaded to your application



Finding your designated neighbourhood school

Use <u>Find My School</u> to view a map of available government schools in your area, including your designated neighbourhood (local) school.

Register for an account

- Click the following link: https://students.educationapps.vic.gov.au/s/
- 2. Scroll down and select Register
- 3. Read the acknowledgement and select Continue
- 4. Enter the requested details
- 5. A verification email will be sent to your inbox (check spam folder)
- 6. Click the link that has been emailed to you to complete registration
- 7. You will be prompted to set a new password
- 8. Select Change Password
- 9. You will land on the portal homepage





Ongoing access to the portal

- 1. Select the following link: https://students.educationapps.vic.gov.au/s/
- 2. Enter your credential details
- 3. Select Log in
- When logging in on a new device, you will be prompted for a verification code
 - · check your email for the code
 - · enter code and select Verify
- 5. You will land on the portal homepage
- 6. To log out, navigate to the drop-down menu and select Logout





Submitting an application

- 1. From the portal homepage, select Apply
- 2. Enter new school application details
- Read the privacy notice and then select Continue
- 4. Enter details for each section (including documentation upload)
- Read Review and Declaration and check all details have been provided and are correct

Note: Once an enrolment enquiry is submitted, enrolment details cannot be edited via the Portal


- Select Submit
- 7. The Application Submission screen will appear and then select Close
- 8. You will be taken to your application list




Viewing, withdrawing or adding files to an application

1. In the portal, select application number to view details, including status



- You can monitor the application status along the top status bar, view application details, withdraw the application or view and upload files
 - To withdraw: select Withdraw Application, enter a reason and the application will be closed
 - To add files: select Add Files at the bottom of the browser and follow instructions





Accepting or not accepting an enrolment offer

IMPORTANT NOTE: Please only accept ONE enrolment offer. All enrolments **must** be accepted via the portal.

- When a school makes an offer of enrolment, you will be notified by email and the status in the portal will be updated
- Select the link in the email, and you will be redirected to the portal
- 3. In the portal, My Applications will display Place Offered
- 4. Select application number
- Select Accept Offer to accept the enrolment offer (only accept ONE) and you will be prompted to provide additional information
- 6. Read the privacy notice and select Continue to proceed
- 7. Enter details for each section (including documentation upload)
- 8. Click Submit
- When the school finalises the application, you will be notified by email notification and the status in the portal will be updated
- 10. If you received multiple enrolment offers, or you no longer wish to proceed with your enrolment application:
 - select Do Not Accept (for each offer to be declined)
 - · enter a reason and the application will be closed

NOTE: Your personal and health information will be shared with the school once you have accepted an enrolment offer.
