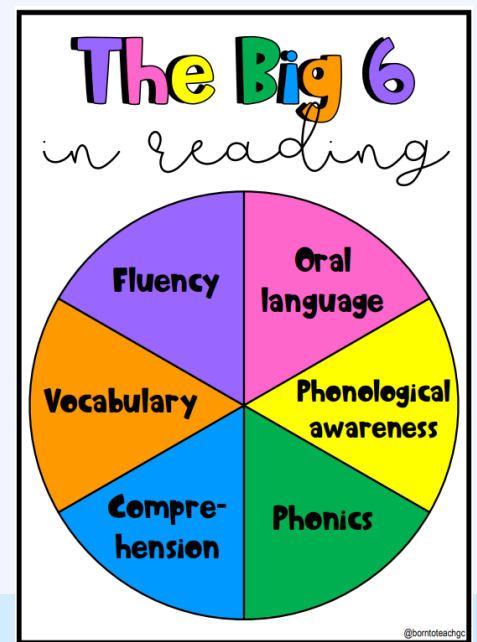
Next week is our last week of Term 1. We hope to see more students back at school.

# The Big Six

Research has shown that there are six key components to successful beginning reading. Because of their importance, they have become known as 'The Big Six': oral language, phonological awareness, phonics, vocabulary, fluency, and comprehension.

Last week we learnt about Oral Language this week we are looking at expanding students' vocabulary.



## How Does Vocabulary Help with Reading?

When children know and understand lots of different words, they will recognise and understand them more easily when reading.

Words can be grouped into three types:

1. Common words (Tier 1) – These are simple, everyday words like the, and, was, dog, happy, play, " and " go. Many of these words appear often in books; some need to be memorised because they cannot be sounded out (e.g., *was* is pronounced "woz").
2. More complex words (Tier 2) – These are words that are less common in conversation but appear in books, such as enormous, discover, prefer.
3. Subject-specific words (Tier 3) – These are words used in specific topics, like photosynthesis in science or multiplication in math.

Children who hear lots of different words at home—through conversations and books read aloud—will have a bigger vocabulary, making reading easier.

## How Can Parents Help?

You can help your child learn new words by:

- Talking and listening – Encourage your child to talk, ask questions, and use new words in conversations.
- Reading aloud – Choose books with rich vocabulary and discuss new words. Ask your child, “What do you think this word means?” or “Have you heard this word before?”
- Playing ‘word detective’ – Look for new and interesting words when you’re out—on signs, menus, pamphlets, or at the zoo or museum.
- Using a variety of words – Try using different words for the same thing (e.g., instead of “big,” say “huge” or “gigantic”). Encourage your child to ask what words mean and use them in conversations.

By making words fun and exciting, your child will build a strong vocabulary that helps them become a better reader!

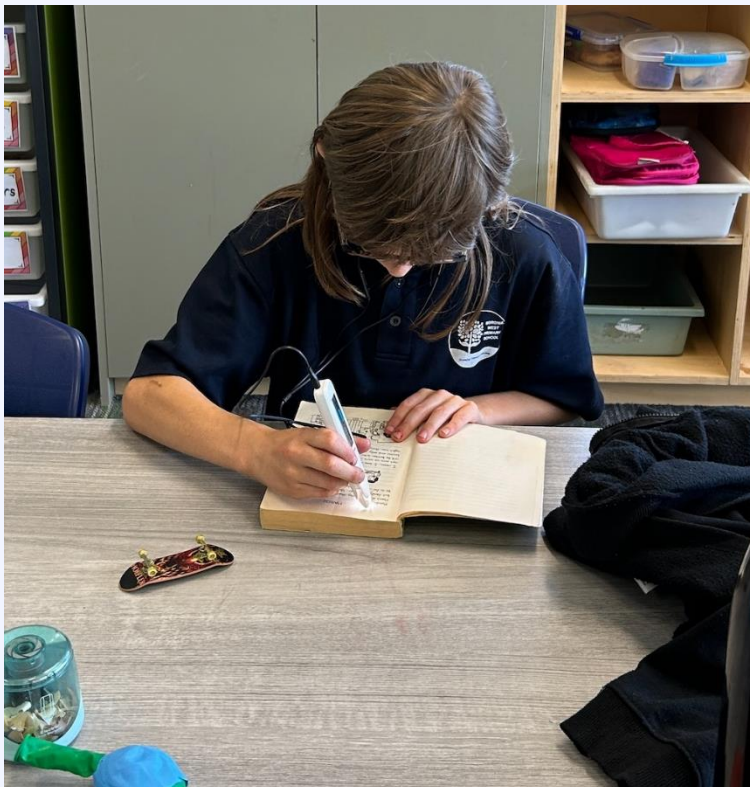


# Senior Class

**Serious stuff!**  
**Medical Management Plan & Medication**

All children who have been diagnosed with a medical condition including allergies, food intolerances, epilepsy, asthma, epilepsy will need to provide:

- A completed Medical Management Plan with a medical photo
- Necessary medication

Please note it is a legal requirement under the Education & Care National Regulations and the Terms and Conditions for bookings that these are provided.

In the interests of child safety, they may not be allowed on the day should the appropriate documentation or medication or medication not be supplied.

**Child Care Subsidy**

Please note that subsidised hours are calculated and allocated by Carelink for a fortnightly basis. Check Carelink for eligibility.

**Fortnightly childcare subsidised hours**

Each session is calculated using the full service operational hours not the hours attended by the child.

Additional Child Care subsidy will not cover any hours beyond the subsidised hours per fortnight.

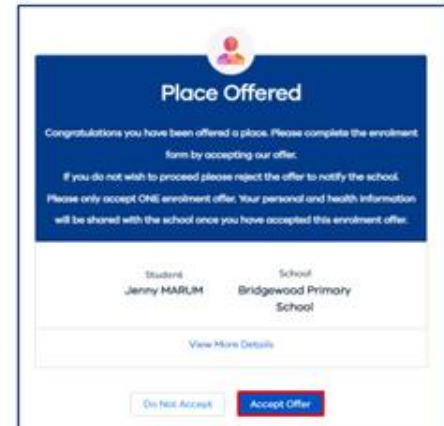
2. You can monitor the application status along the top status bar, view application details, withdraw the application or view and upload files
  - **To withdraw:** select **Withdraw Application**, enter a reason and the application will be closed
  - **To add files:** select **Add Files** at the bottom of the browser and follow instructions



## Accepting or not accepting an enrolment offer

**IMPORTANT NOTE:** Please only accept ONE enrolment offer. All enrolments **must** be accepted via the portal.

1. When a school makes an offer of enrolment, you will be notified by email and the status in the portal will be updated
2. Select the link in the email, and you will be redirected to the portal
3. In the portal, **My Applications** will display **Place Offered**
4. Select **application number**
5. Select **Accept Offer** to accept the enrolment offer (only accept ONE) and you will be prompted to provide additional information
6. Read the **privacy notice** and select **Continue** to proceed
7. Enter details for each section (including documentation upload)
8. Click **Submit**
9. When the school finalises the application, you will be notified by email notification and the status in the portal will be updated
10. If you received multiple enrolment offers, or you no longer wish to proceed with your enrolment application:
  - select **Do Not Accept** (for each offer to be declined)
  - enter a reason and the application will be closed



**NOTE:** Your personal and health information will be shared with the school once you have accepted an enrolment offer.

# FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE

## INFORMATION FOR PARENTS

**Every Victorian child should have access to the world of learning opportunities that exist beyond the classroom. The Camps, Sports and Excursions Fund helps ensure that no student will miss out on the opportunity to join their classmates for important, educational and fun activities. It is part of making Victoria the Education State and the Government’s commitment to breaking the link between a student’s background and their outcomes.**

### CAMPS, SPORTS & EXCURSIONS FUND (CSEF)

School camps provide children with inspiring experiences in the great outdoors. Excursions encourage a deeper understanding of how the world works while sports teach teamwork, discipline and leadership. All are a part of a healthy curriculum.

CSEF is provided by the Victorian Government to assist eligible families to cover the costs of school trips, camps and sporting activities.

If you hold a valid means-tested concession card or are a temporary foster parent, you may be eligible for CSEF. A special consideration category also exists for asylum seeker and refugee families. The allowance is paid to the school to use towards expenses relating to camps, excursions or sporting activities for the benefit of your child.

The annual CSEF amount per student is:

- \$154 for primary school students
- \$256 for secondary school students

### HOW TO APPLY

New applicants should contact the school office to obtain a CSEF application form or download from the website below.

If you applied for CSEF at your child’s school last year, you do not need to complete an application form this year unless there has been a change in your family circumstances.

You only need to complete an application form if any of the following changes have occurred:

- **new student enrolments:** your child has started or changed schools this year.
- **changed family circumstances:** such as a change of custody, change of name, concession card number, or new siblings commencing this year.
