Why Sleep Matters: Rested Kids, Ready Minds

At Dillbadin Primary School, we are committed to nurturing the whole child- not just academically, but emotionally and physically too. One key element of children's well-being that is often overlooked in our busy lives is sleep. Ensuring our students get enough high-quality rest is just as important as making sure they attend school, eat well, and feel safe.

The Role of Sleep in a Child's Growth and Development

Sleep is vital for growing minds and bodies. During sleep, children's brains are hard at work processing what they've learned, solving problems, building memory, and restoring emotional balance. It's also the time when the body releases growth hormones and strengthens the immune system.

Children between the ages of 5 and 12 need around 9 to 11 hours of sleep each night. However, studies show that many Australian children are falling short—often due to screen time, busy schedules, or inconsistent bedtime routines.

Sleep and School Success: The Science Is Clear

A well-rested child is more likely to be:

- **Emotionally Resilient**: Children who get enough sleep are better equipped to manage stress, express emotions calmly, and bounce back from setbacks.
- **Focused and Engaged**: Tired children may find it hard to concentrate in class, follow instructions, and stay motivated.
- **Socially Confident**: Sleep-deprived children often experience mood swings and irritability, which can affect friendships and group work.
- **Ready to Learn**: Memory, creativity, and problem-solving skills all improve when children are well-rested- making learning more effective and enjoyable.

Simply put, sleep is a superpower when it comes to doing well in school and feeling good about life.

Sleep, Anxiety, and School Transitions

For many children, especially those navigating new year levels, changing classrooms, or preparing to move on to secondary school, sleep can be disrupted by anxiety or worry about school transitions. Big changes, even positive ones, can feel overwhelming for young minds. Poor sleep can make anxiety feel worse, and anxiety can make it harder to fall asleep. Supporting your child through routines, open conversations, and calming activities before bed can help reduce nighttime worries and build emotional security during these times of change.

Our students have again earned 3 leaves in the past week, which is 300 acknowledgements of positive behaviour.

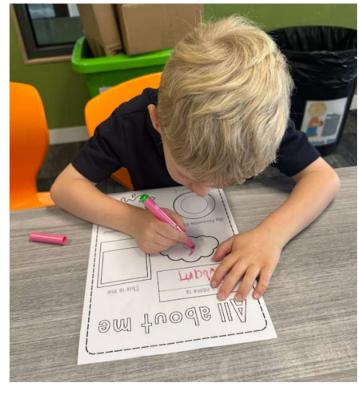

Digital Enrolment Parent/Carer Quick Reference Guide

Enrolling your child is quick and easy using your laptop or desktop

Before you begin



Google Chrome is the recommended browser



Ensure your listed Emergency contact is someone **other than** Adult A or Adult B



Use of a laptop or desktop is recommended



Check your details are complete **before** submitting

You can't edit after submission



Use the **Save** button if you need to walk away



Have all your digital documents ready as they must be uploaded to your application

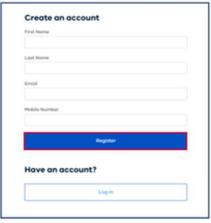
e.g. Birth certificate, Proof of Address, Proof of Residency

Finding your designated neighbourhood school

Use <u>Find My School</u> to view a map of available government schools in your area, including your designated neighbourhood (local) school.

Register for an account

- 1. Click the following link: https://students.educationapps.vic.gov.au/s/
- Scroll down and select Register
- 3. Read the acknowledgement and select Continue
- 4. Enter the requested details
- 5. A verification email will be sent to your inbox (check spam folder)
- 6. Click the link that has been emailed to you to complete registration
- 7. You will be prompted to set a new password
- 8. Select Change Password
- 9. You will land on the portal homepage





Ongoing access to the portal

- 1. Select the following link: https://students.educationapps.vic.gov.au/s/
- 2. Enter your credential details
- 3. Select Log in
- When logging in on a new device, you will be prompted for a verification code
 - · check your email for the code
 - · enter code and select Verify
- 5. You will land on the portal homepage
- 6. To log out, navigate to the drop-down menu and select Logout





Submitting an application

- From the portal homepage, select Apply
- 2. Enter new school application details
- 3. Read the privacy notice and then select Continue
- 4. Enter details for each section (including documentation upload)
- Read Review and Declaration and check all details have been provided and are correct

Note: Once an enrolment enquiry is submitted, enrolment details cannot be edited via the Portal

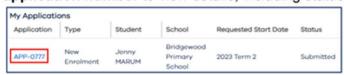
- Select Submit
- 7. The Application Submission screen will appear and then select Close
- 8. You will be taken to your application list

Start a new application Enquire and apply directly to local schools in your area

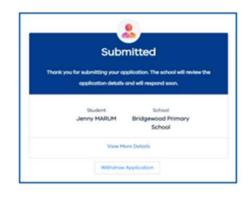


Viewing, withdrawing or adding files to an application

1. In the portal, select application number to view details, including status



- You can monitor the application status along the top status bar, view application details, withdraw the application or view and upload files
 - To withdraw: select Withdraw Application, enter a reason and the application will be closed
 - To add files: select Add Files at the bottom of the browser and follow instructions



Accepting or not accepting an enrolment offer

IMPORTANT NOTE: Please only accept ONE enrolment offer. All enrolments **must** be accepted via the portal.

- When a school makes an offer of enrolment, you will be notified by email and the status in the portal will be updated
- 2. Select the link in the email, and you will be redirected to the portal
- 3. In the portal, My Applications will display Place Offered
- 4. Select application number
- Select Accept Offer to accept the enrolment offer (only accept ONE) and you will be prompted to provide additional information
- 6. Read the privacy notice and select Continue to proceed
- 7. Enter details for each section (including documentation upload)
- 8. Click Submit
- When the school finalises the application, you will be notified by email notification and the status in the portal will be updated
- 10. If you received multiple enrolment offers, or you no longer wish to proceed with your enrolment application:
 - select Do Not Accept (for each offer to be declined)
 - enter a reason and the application will be closed

NOTE: Your personal and health information will be shared with the school once you have accepted an enrolment offer.
